<p>Unit Theme: Stories vs Informational Text: On the Farm</p>	<p>October 15-19, 2018</p> 										
<p>Language Arts/Reading <u>Phonemic Awareness</u> – Students will continue to blend sounds together to make new words. We will also continue to segment sounds in words. <u>Phonics</u> – Students will blend words with new letters v, z, p, and e. We will continue to focus on left and right tracking. We will learn new sight words it, is, and can. <u>Literature</u> – Students will explore answering the question: What makes a good story? Students will determine the differences between informational text and stories. We will use stories and books that focus on farm animals to explore these topics. We will begin to focus on setting. <u>Writing</u> – Students will practice using response journals to answer sentence prompts. We will focus on verbs and using a strategy for writing and speaking in a complete sentence, adding details to our writing.</p>	<p>Things to work on at home with your child:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Write name (capital and lowercase) -Count to 20 by ones - Read with your child every night - Practice tying shoes -Practice fastening and unfastening belts -Practice writing numbers 0-10 in increasing and decreasing order -Use the words RIGHT and LEFT as often as possible in daily communication. A green dot at the starting point for writing will be helpful for beginning writers!
